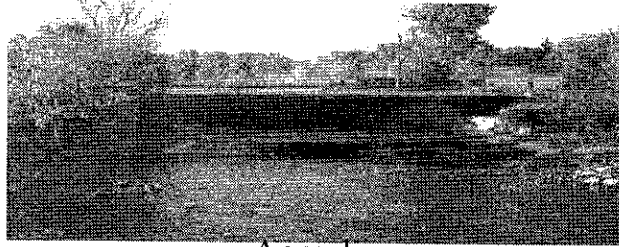

Mayor Dishaw called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance at 6:00 p.m.

A motion was made by Trustee Decillis, seconded by Trustee Proven to approve the minutes of the January 3, 2022 meeting. The motion was carried.

Public Comment: Lee Carpenter, 159 N. Main St. was present to discuss the issue of speeding on village streets. He presented pricing for radar signs that would mount on street signs or telephone poles. Police Chief Wood stated that the Village of Evans Mills has one that they move to different streets. He stated that it isn't utilized in the winter months because the battery doesn't last in the cold weather.

Code Enforcement Report: CEO Holland stated that the Azah project has slowed down for the winter, he has done some fire inspections and he received a complaint from a tenant at 110 LeRay St. regarding some electrical and other issues. He stated that there are some upcoming changes to the Ny State Uniform and Energy Code that will have to be adopted by the village by December 2022. He stated that the board can approve the changes as presented or make modifications.

Police Department Report: Police Chief Wood stated that the police vehicle was backed into at the Stewart's Shop in Evans Mills. He stated that he has contacted the insurance company. Police Chief Wood discussed the option of hiring a second police officer to work eight hours per week. He stated that he would be discussing the extra officer with Evans Mills.

Clerk-Treasurer's Report: Clerk-Treasurer Williams stated that Chimera brought to her attention the fire alarms are supposed to be inspected annually and to her knowledge they have not been. She stated that Chimera gave her a quote for the inspection in the amount of \$1170 and that there would be additional charges if repairs were needed.

Superintendent's Report: Superintendent Williams stated that he spoke with Beam Mack and the cab and chassis for the new plow truck have been built. He stated that he would like to put a camera in the plow for safety purposes. He stated that Joe and Hunter have changed several meters. Superintendent Williams stated that he and Assistant Superintendent Matt Leary both need training hours for their water licenses and would like for them both to attend the annual NY Rural Water conference. He stated that National Grid has hired Nelson Tree Service to take down trees that are interfering with power lines. He stated that he had informed the tree service that the village would not be responsible for the cleanup. He stated that an alarm panel has been put in the Maple St. pump station and that he would like the board to consider making E. Dexter St. no parking the whole length of the river side. It was agreed that a letter would be sent to the Black River American Legion requesting that they ask their patrons not to park there. Superintendent Williams stated that in the past year the DPW has responded to 150 UFPOs, collected 160 loads of brush, spent 85 hours on spring cleanup and the village pumped 71 million gallons of water for the year.

Correspondence Received: The board reviewed the correspondence regarding funding the library.

A motion was made by Trustee Decillis, seconded by Mayor Dishaw to accept the resignation of Christopher Mueller from the Zoning Board of Appeals. The motion was carried.

The board reviewed a letter from David Leonard regarding the Planning Board.

The Year 2022 monitoring requirements for your community water system are **attached**. You are responsible for all testing and reporting of analytical results from an appropriate laboratory certified by New York State. **Do not collect samples until your operator has contacted the writer or Mr. Curley.**


Routine daily and monthly monitoring requirements remain unchanged.

You are responsible for preparing and distributing an updated Annual Water Quality Report (AWQR) **prior to May 31st**. Remember to include all sampling data in your AWQR tables that were detected parameters (If you monitor less than once per year for some parameters, you must include the most recent data.). Certification that the AWQR was delivered must be provided **by September 1st**.

This letter and attached sample schedule must be displayed at the water treatment plants and be available for review upon inspection.



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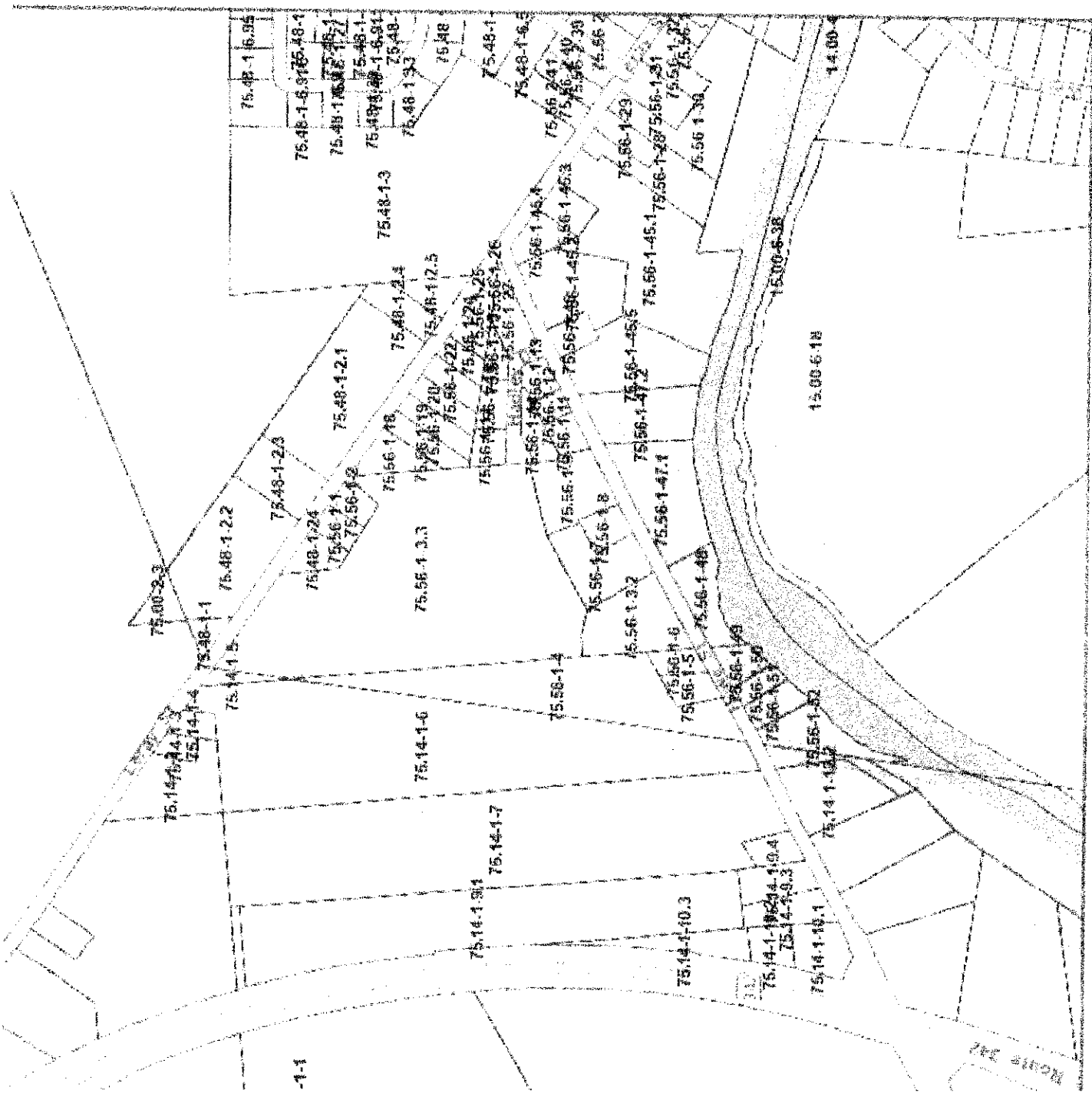

SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL

THIS AGREEMENT made this ___ day of _____ 2022, made by and between the **TOWN OF LERAY**, a municipal corporation with offices located at 8650 LeRay Street, Evans Mills, New York 13637, (hereinafter "LeRay"), and the **TOWN OF THERESA** a municipal corporation with offices located at 215 Riverside Avenue, Theresa, New York 13691, (hereinafter "Theresa") **THE TOWN OF PAMELIA** a municipal corporation with offices located at 25859 NYS Route 37, Watertown, New York 13601 (hereinafter "Pamelia"), **THE TOWN OF PHILADELPHIA** a municipal corporation with offices located at 33019 US Route 11, Philadelphia, New York 13673(hereinafter "Philadelphia"), and **THE VILLAGE OF BLACK RIVER** a municipal corporation with offices located at 107 Jefferson Place, Black River, New York 13612 (hereinafter "the Village"), (individual the "Municipality" and collectively the "Municipalities").

WHEREAS, the Highway Departments and/or the Departments of Public Works for each of the Municipalities regularly provide snow and ice removal on portions of the other Municipalities' roads as more particularly described on the attached Schedule "A"; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into this Shared Services Agreement to memorialize the existing arrangement and document their respective responsibilities in relation thereto; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, it is agreed,

1. The foregoing recitations are incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if fully set forth hereafter.

2. The Term of the agreement shall commence upon its execution and shall terminate March 31, 2023.

3. Each Municipality shall continue to provide snow and ice removal on the roads of the other Municipality as set forth on the attached Schedule "A".

4. Services under this Agreement shall be provided on an as needed basis as determined by the Highway Superintendent of the respective Municipality, but consistent with Snow & Ice Removal processes done on Town/Village roads and streets.

5. Each Municipality represents and warrants that it has and shall continue to provide liability insurance for bodily injury and property damage on all its vehicles and equipment and shall maintain worker's compensation coverage on its employees through the Jefferson County Self-Insurance Program.

6. Each Municipality agrees to and hereby does indemnify and hold the other Municipalities harmless from any liability of any nature whatsoever for bodily injury or property damage caused by or occasioned as a result of the services provided hereunder by the Municipality or due to the condition of Town/Village roads and streets including the design, width, turning radiuses, and signage on said streets and any other design elements of Town/Village roads and streets.

7. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and may not be changed, modified or altered except in writing duly signed and acknowledged by the parties.

8. This agreement shall be interpreted by and in accordance of the laws of the State of New York.
